Sarah Parcak is credited with being the first Egyptologist to use satellite imaging to identify new archaeological sites in Egypt. As an Egyptologist, Parcak's focus is on using these satellite images to locate buried temples, tombs, roads, and even entire cities that were once part of ancient Egyptian civilization. 


The Life & Long Shadow of Senator Joe McCarthy

WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 16 | 4:30PM Larry Tye, *New York Times* Best-Selling Author

Demagogue is Larry Tye's most recent biography of Senator Joe McCarthy. Tye speaks about how the senator learned from demagogues who came before and was the archetype for those who followed; why his family gave Tye the revealing trove of professional and personal papers that had been under lock and key for 60 years; and how his never-seen medical records offered a novel lens into how he lived and died.

Larry Tye, who graduated from Brown University, was a Nieman Fellow at Harvard University in 1993-94. He taught journalism at Boston University, Northeastern, and Tufts. In addition to his writing, Tye runs the Boston-based Health Coverage Fellowship, which helps the media do a better job reporting on critical issues like public health and pandemics, mental health and the health impacts of climate change, and racial, ethnic and gender disparities in health care.



The Search for the Source of the Nile

WEDNESDAY, JANUARY 4 | 4:30PM Candice Millard, Best-Selling Author & Historian

Candice Millard tells the story of the harrowing journey to find the source of the Nile. For millenia the location of the Nile River's headwaters was shrouded in mystery. In the 19th century, Richard Burton and John Hanning Speke set out to claim the prize for England. From the start the two men clashed as they endured tremendous hardships, illness, and constant setbacks, relying on the help of Sidi Mubarak Bombay, a formerly enslaved man who was their porter, translator, guide, nurse, and trusted friend.

Candice Millard is the author of four *New York Times* bestselling books. Her first book, *The River of Doubt: Theodore Roosevelt's Darkest Journey*, a Barnes & Noble Discover Great New Writers selection and a Book Sense Pick, won the William Rockhill Nelson Award, was a finalist for the Quill Awards, and has been published in multiple foreign editions.





The Words That Made Us


TUESDAY, JANUARY 10 | 4:30PM Akhil Reed Amar, Sterling Professor of Law & Political Science, Yale University

Based on excerpts from his new book, The Words That Made Us: America's Constitutional Conversation, 1760-1840, Akhil Reed Amar will explore key figures and critical moments in the early life of the American constitutional project. Come prepared to hear about (and ask questions about) the Declaration of Independence, the framing and ratification of the Constitution, the enactment of the Bill of Rights, the death scenes and legacies of America's leading founders, and more.

Akhil Reed Amar is Sterling Professor of Law and Political Science at Yale University, where he teaches constitutional law in both Yale College and Yale Law School. His work has won awards from both the American Bar Association and the Federalist Society, and he has been cited by Supreme Court justices across the spectrum in more than 40 cases.

In The Hands of the People

SATURDAY, JANUARY 21 | 3:30PM Jon Meacham, Presidential Historian & Annette Gordon-Reed, American Historian

Jon Meacham offers a collection of inspiring words about how to be a good citizen, from Thomas Jefferson and others, and reminds us why our country's founding principles are still so important today, with an afterword by Annette Gordon-Reed. This lecture will revitalize how to see an individual's role in the world, as Meacham and Gordon-Reed explore such Jeffersonian concepts as religious freedom, the importance of a free press, public education, participation in government, and others.

Annette Gordon-Reed is the Carl M. Loeb University Professor at Harvard University. Gordon-Reed won 16 book prizes, including the Pulitzer Prize and the National Book Award, for *The Hemingses of Monticello: An American Family* (2008). Jon Meacham is a renowned presidential historian, contributing writer to *The New York Times Book Review*, contributing editor at TIME, and Pulitzer Prize-winning author.



Under a White Sky: The Nature of the Future

WEDNESDAY, JANUARY 25 | 4:30PM Elizabet Kolbert, Pulitzer Prize-Winning Author


Elizabeth Kolbert takes a hard look at humanity's transformative impact on the environment and the new world we are creating. Along the way, she meets biologists who are trying to preserve the world's rarest fish, which lives in a single tiny pool in the middle of the Mojave; engineers who are turning carbon emissions to stone in Iceland; Australian researchers who are trying to develop a "super coral" that can survive on a hotter globe; and physicists who are contemplating shooting tiny diamonds into the stratosphere to cool the earth. After doing so much damage, can we change nature, this time to save it?

Elizabeth Kolbert is the author of Field Notes from a Catastrophe: Man, Nature, and Climate Change and The Sixth Extinction, for which she won the Pulitzer Prize. Under a White Sky has been shortlisted for the Wainwright Prize for Writing on Global Conservation.

Travels of Ibn Battutah

TUESDAY, JANUARY 31 | 4:30PM Tim Mackintosh-Smith, Arabist, Traveler and Author

Tim Mackintosh-Smith, historian and traveler, was fascinated by the relationships between time, place and human character. His books include a travel trilogy pursuing the fourteenth-century wanderer, Ibn Battutah, around three continents. Ibn Battutah was just 21 when he set out in 1325 from his native Tangier on a pilgrimage to Mecca. He did not return to Morocco for another 29 years, traveling instead through more than 40 countries on the modern map, covering 75,000 miles and getting as far north as the Volga, as far east as China, and as far south as Tanzania. He wrote of his travels, and comes across as a superb ethnographer, biographer, anecdotal historian, and occasional botanist and gastronome.

Martin Walker has now retired after 30 years in journalism for the Guardian and UPI, and a second career with another ten years in thinktanks including the World Policy Council, the Woodrow Wilson Center for Scholars, and as Director of the Global Business Policy Council. Now in his 8th year returning to Boca Grande, Martin Walker explores the possible outcomes and implications of Ukraine, Putin, and Europe. With patterns at the forefront: once again, Europe faces a dictator with territorial ambitions in Europe and an ally in Asia; once again, Europe is disunited, economically battered, and politically divided; once again, Europe realizes that it will need the USA. Ancient Greece: Art, Science, and War


TUESDAY, FEBRUARY 28 | 4:30PM Nigel McGilchrist, Historian, Author, and International Travel Expert

Ancient Greece - How is it relevant to us today? Do we see the dangers and dilemmas which we face in the confrontation with Russia over Ukraine when we look at the Great War between Athens and Sparta through the eyes of the West's first and most thoughtful historian? History repeats itself, and there are valuable lessons for us about negotiation, escalation and the imagined "inevitability" of war in Thucydides's analysis of a world-shaking confrontation which happened 2,400 years ago. To think perceptively about any aspect of the mind of Ancient Greece helps us to understand who we are, where our science and art come from, and why we think the way we do.

Our panel of local island experts will discuss how the combination of a pandemic, a war in the Ukraine and inflation have caused tectonic shifts in many areas of economics, technology, politics, and society including cost of living, trade and the supply chain, food supply, energy policy and immigration. The group will answer questions such as: Is there a crisis in the worldwide food supply and what are the implications to the U.S. and others? As we attempt to transition to a more sustainable energy mix, are we adapting to meet the need of our power demands that will be required to supplement renewables well beyond 2050? What trends are taking place in the leadership in technology which may change the digital divide?





Reclaiming Global Leadership through Soft Power

WEDNESDAY, MARCH 8 | 4:30PM Daniel Runde, Strategist and Expert in Global Affairs

Daniel F. Runde is Senior Vice President and holds the William A. Schreyer Chair in Global Analysis at the Center for Strategic and International Studies, and author of the new book *The American Imperative: Reclaiming Global Leadership through Soft Power*. This urgent and timely book argues that non-military soft power is the primary approach the U.S. must use now to maintain global dominance and order at a time when both are threatened by China and Russia.

The book calls for: supporting broad based economic growth, supporting good governance and anti-corruption, long term training, differentiating our approaches in middle-income countries and fragile states, and stronger U.S. leadership in the multilateral system. Runde aims to spark a national conversation about how and for what end we are going to use our non-military forms of our power overseas given the challenges and opportunities in front of us as a country.





The Unfulfilled Presidency of Jimmy Carter

Four decades after Ronald Reagan's landslide win in 1980, Jimmy Carter's oneterm presidency is often labeled a failure; indeed, many Americans view Carter as the only ex-president to have used the White House as a stepping-stone to greater achievements. But in retrospect the Carter political odyssey is a rich and human story, marked by both formidable accomplishments and painful political adversity. In this deeply researched, brilliantly written account, Kai Bird expertly unfolds the Carter saga as a tragic tipping point in American history.



Kai Bird is the acclaimed author of biographies of John J. McCloy and of McGeorge and William Bundy. He won the Pulitzer Prize for biography for *American Prometheus: The Triumph and Tragedy of J. Robert Oppenheimer* (co-authored with Martin J. Sherwin). His work includes critical writings on the Vietnam War, Hiroshima, nuclear weapons, the Cold War, the Arab-Israeli conflict, and the CIA.




Harry Truman's Excellent Adventure



Matthew Algeo recounts the amazing journey of a former president and his wife and their amusing, failed attempts to keep a low profile. In the summer of 1953, just five months after leaving the White House, Harry and Bess Truman drove themselves back East to visit their daughter Margaret. Diners, bellhops, and cabbies shouted out "Hiya, Harry!" whenever they recognized the former president. Along the way there are brief detours into topics such as the postwar American auto industry, McCarthyism, the development of the nation's highway system, and the decline of Main Street America. By the end of the 2,500-mile journey, you will have a new and heartfelt appreciation for America's last citizen-president.

Matthew is an award-winning journalist and author. He has reported from four continents, and his stories have appeared on some of the most popular public radio programs in the United States.

Delivered Under Fire: Absalom Markland and Freedom's Mail

WEDNESDAY, APRIL 12 | 4:30PM Candice Hooper, Author & Historian

Boca Grande's own award-winning military historian, Candice Shy Hooper, returns to the Community Center to tell the tale of a forgotten Civil War hero. Her latest book, *Delivered Under Fire: Absalom Markland and Freedom's Mail*, reveals the story of the courageous, innovative, self-made man who invented the United States military mail service during that war.

From Fort Donelson in 1862 to City Point in 1865, Markland traveled with Ulysses Grant's armies, assuring the swiftest possible delivery of mail, sometimes even as bullets whizzed overhead. It was an enormous undertaking, essential to morale on the frontlines and on the home front. He visited regularly with Lincoln and aided Sherman's March to the Sea. As Grant's responsibilities grew to embrace the entire U.S. Army, so did Markland's. Then, when Grant became President, he called on Markland again, to help him in the fight against the Ku Klux Klan — a story told here for the first time.
